

Children can start in the nursery the term after their third birthday.

Currently, all 3 and 4 year olds are entitled to 15 hours of free child-care a week and this will remain in place at Cecil Road Primary & Nursery School for all our families.

The times of the sessions are:

Morning 8:30am—11:30am

Afternoon 12:30am—3:30pm

Cecil Road Nursery provides free nursery education for children from 3 to 5 years.

The building and outdoor area is designed specifically for young children.

We aim to provide a stimulating, caring, safe and structured environment in which your child can learn.

Early Years Foundation Stage

Our curriculum focuses on the distinct needs of young children. Through supported play, they explore, develop and use their curiosity and imagination to help them make sense of world. They practice skills, build up ideas and concepts, think creatively and imaginatively and communicate with others as they investigate and solve problems.

The children are helped to socialise with others, express their emotions clearly and develop confidence and independence as they experience the environment.

Construction toys, mark making, role play and outdoor play are also on offer. The children listen to stories and join in counting rhymes and songs.
