

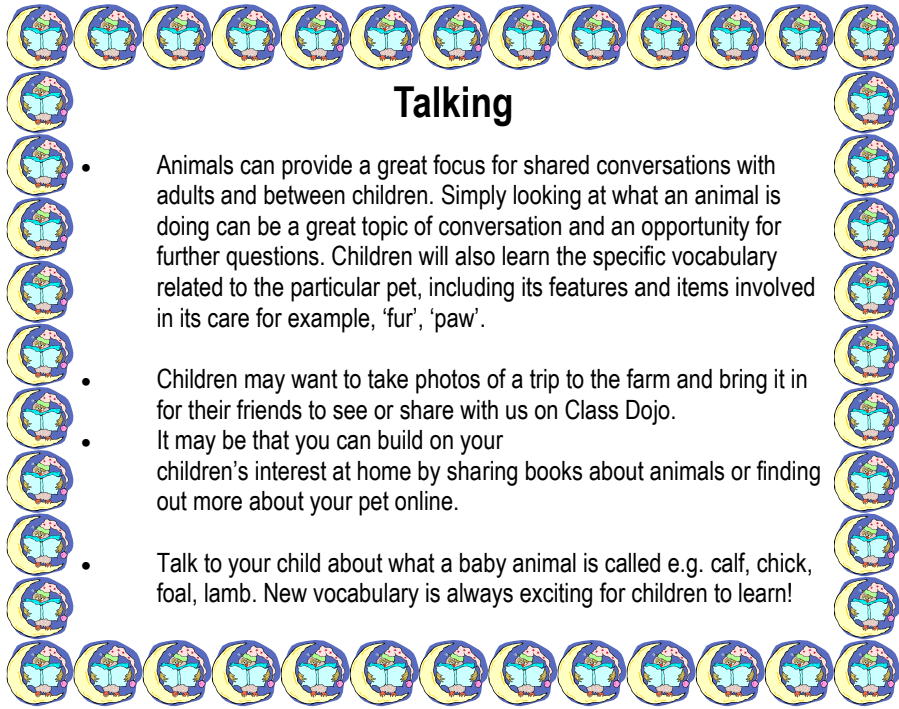


Nursery Newsletter

Our theme this term is **The Farm**. We will be learning and talking about the different animals on a farm, alongside discovering the wonderful celebration of Easter and Spring. Here are some fun suggestions to support your child at home.



Talking

- Animals can provide a great focus for shared conversations with adults and between children. Simply looking at what an animal is doing can be a great topic of conversation and an opportunity for further questions. Children will also learn the specific vocabulary related to the particular pet, including its features and items involved in its care for example, 'fur', 'paw'.
- Children may want to take photos of a trip to the farm and bring it in for their friends to see or share with us on Class Dojo.
- It may be that you can build on your children's interest at home by sharing books about animals or finding out more about your pet online.
- Talk to your child about what a baby animal is called e.g. calf, chick, foal, lamb. New vocabulary is always exciting for children to learn!

Making

- Can you draw three animals which live on a farm?
- Could you make a map of a visit to the farm?
- Invite your child to make a paper plate animal or an animal using junk modelling. Can you share these with us on class dojo?
